Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 4, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the Feast of **Saint John Vianney**, the patron saint of parish priests. We have a statue of him in our church, next to the door that leads to the rectory. Born in Lyons, France, in 1786, Saint John Vianney heard the Lord calling him to the vocation to the priesthood as a young man. Once he entered the seminary, he struggled with his studies, specifically in learning Latin. Instead of giving up, he sought out help in private tutoring. He persevered through this difficulty and was ordained a priest. Fr. Vianney's first parish assignment was to a church in the little town of Ars, France. It was a very difficult assignment because the people had become indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. They didn't seem to want to grow in their relationship with the Lord. Through his preaching, his mortification, prayer and good works, Fr. Vianney won over the hearts of his parishioners, enkindling within them a desire to give themselves more to the Lord. In the winter months, he would hear Confessions for almost twelve hours a day, and during the summer months, he would be there for sixteen hours a day. He ate and slept very little, doing penance for his sins and for the sins of others. With the help of two women, he established a home for girls called "La Providence". Many people came back to the Lord through Saint John Vianney. From "The Saint of the Day" publication: *"Indifference toward religion, coupled with a love for material comfort, seem to be common signs of our times. A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us to be pilgrim people, on our way to somewhere else. John Vianney, on the other hand, was a man on a journey with his goal before him at all times."* My brothers and sisters, let us always remember that we are a pilgrim people, on a journey to Heaven. Let us allow the Lord to work in our lives, making time for Him each day through prayer, through weekly reception of His Body and Blood at Mass, and frequent reception of His forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession. May Saint John Vianney enkindle within each one of us the desire to grow in our

relationship with the Lord, and may he intercede for all of us who are priests (especially yours truly), that we may always be faithful in our vocations in serving you as the people God. God bless!

EAT! EAT!

“He gave them bread from the heavens to eat.”
—**John 6:31**. Today’s Gospel reading from the sixth chapter of John begins Jesus’ famous Bread of Life discourse, which we read for four consecutive Sundays. There is a distinct, intentional progression in the words of Jesus regarding our response to this heavenly Bread.

During the first part of the discourse, Jesus emphasizes that we must believe He is the Bread of Life. The word believe is used four times from verses 29 through 47. Jesus teaches that we must believe in Him, and accordingly, believe the truths He is revealing. “I Myself am the Bread of Life. No one who comes to Me shall ever be hungry, no one who believes in Me shall ever thirst” (Jn 6:35; cf 1 Cor 11:24-25).

Jesus makes an abrupt, intentional transition in the last half of the discourse. He stops using the word “believe” and begins using verbs and nouns referring to eating and drinking. For nine consecutive verses, 50 through 58, the verbs eat and drink or nouns for food and drink are used. “If anyone eats this bread he shall live forever” (Jn 6:51). “If you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you” (Jn 6:53). “The man who feeds on this bread shall live forever” (Jn 6:58).

Jesus clearly states that anyone who believes in Him will take the next step and eat His Eucharistic flesh. His initial hearers understood exactly the progression Jesus was making; many just refused to obey and eat (Jn 6:60ff). What about you? What will you do in response to Jesus’ clear words? “Unless you eat...”

Prayer: Father, every day, or as often as possible, I will open wide my mouth so You may fill it with the food of Your Eucharistic Body and Blood (Ps 81:11, 17).

Promise: “He rained manna upon them for food and gave them heavenly bread.” —Ps 78:24

Praise: Praise You, Jesus, Bread of Life (Jn 6:35). Alleluia! Presentation Ministries

Little Sisters of the Poor to hold Summer Soirée

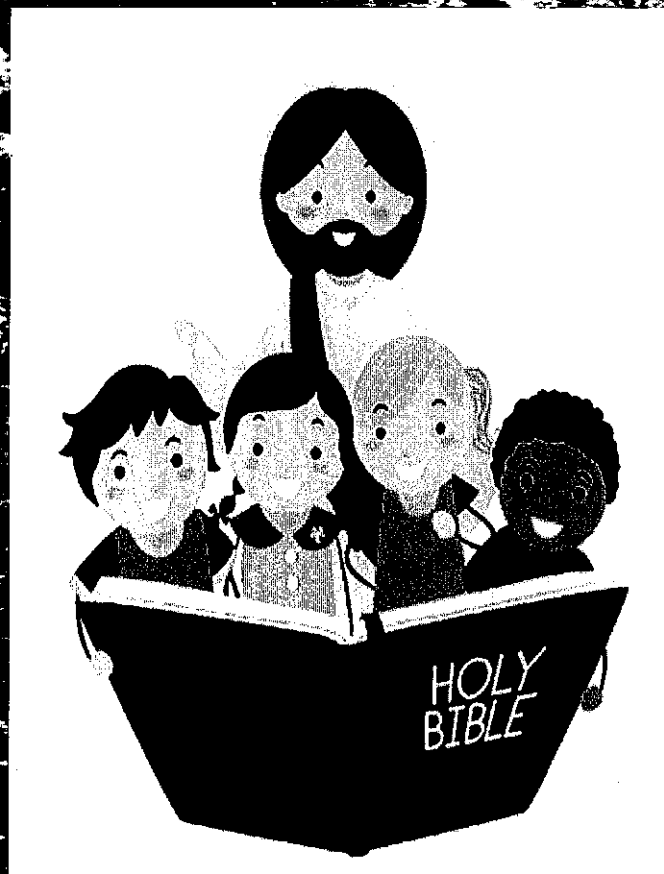

Décimo Octavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

4 de Agosto, 2024

Queridos feligreses,
Este domingo es la fiesta de **San Juan Vianney**, el santo patrón de los párrocos. Tenemos una estatua de él en nuestra iglesia, al lado de la puerta que conduce a la rectoría. Nacido en Lyon, Francia, en 1786, San Juan Vianney escuchó al Señor que lo llamaba a la vocación al sacerdocio cuando era joven. Una vez que ingresó al seminario, tuvo dificultades con sus estudios, específicamente en el aprendizaje del latín. En lugar de darse por vencido, buscó ayuda en clases particulares. Perseveró a través de esta dificultad y fue ordenado sacerdote. La primera asignación parroquial de Padre Juan Vianney fue a una iglesia en el pequeño pueblo de Ars, Francia. Fue una tarea muy difícil porque la gente se había vuelto indiferente y bastante cómoda con su estilo de vida. No parecían querer crecer en su relación con el Señor. A través de su predicación, su mortificación, su oración y sus buenas obras, el Padre Vianney conquistó los corazones de sus feligreses, encendiendo en ellos el deseo de entregarse más al Señor. En los meses de invierno, escuchaba Confesiones durante casi doce horas al día, y durante los meses de verano, estaba allí dieciséis horas al día. Comía y dormía muy poco, haciendo penitencia por sus pecados y por los pecados de los demás. Con la ayuda de dos mujeres, estableció un hogar para niñas llamado "La Providence". Muchas personas volvieron al Señor a través de San Juan Vianney. De la publicación "El Santo del Día": *"La indiferencia hacia la religión, junto con el amor por la comodidad material, parecen ser signos comunes de nuestros tiempos. Es probable que una persona de otro planeta que nos observa no nos juzgue como personas peregrinas, de camino a otro lugar. Juan Vianney, por otro lado, era un hombre en un viaje con su objetivo delante de él en todo momento"*. Mis hermanos y hermanas, recordemos siempre que somos un pueblo peregrino, en un viaje al cielo. Permitamos que el Señor obre en nuestras vidas, haciendo tiempo para Él cada día a través de la oración, a través de la recepción semanal de Su Cuerpo y Sangre en la Misa, y la recepción frecuente de Su perdón en el

Sacramento de la Confesión. Que San Juan Vianney encienda en cada uno de nosotros el deseo de crecer en nuestra relación con el Señor, y que interceda por todos los que somos sacerdotes, para que siempre podamos ser fieles en nuestras vocaciones al servirle como el pueblo de Dios.

¡Dios los bendiga!

¡COMAN!, ¡COMAN!

“Les dio de comer el pan bajado del cielo” (Juan 6:31).

La lectura del Evangelio de hoy es del capítulo sexto de san Juan, donde empieza el famoso discurso del pan de vida, que leeremos en su totalidad durante los próximos cuatro domingos. Hay una progresión clara e intensa en las palabras de Jesús acerca de nuestra respuesta a este pan bajado del cielo.

Durante la primera parte del discurso, Jesús enfatiza que debemos creer que Él es el Pan de vida. La palabra creer se usa cuatro veces desde el verso 29 al 47. Jesús enseña que debemos creer en Él y, consecuentemente, creer en las verdades que Él revela. “Yo soy el Pan de vida. El que viene a Mí jamás tendrá hambre, y el que cree en Mí jamás tendrá sed” (Jn 6:35; ver 1 Co 11:24-25).

Jesús le da un giro abrupto e intencional a la segunda mitad de su discurso. Deja de usar la palabra “creer” y empieza a usar verbos y nombres que se refieren a la comida y bebida. En nueve versículos consecutivos, del 50 al 58, los verbos “comer” y “beber”, o nombres como “comida” y “bebida” se usan repetidamente. “El que coma de este pan vivirá eternamente” (Jn 6:51). “Les aseguro que, si no comen la carne del Hijo del hombre y no beben Su sangre, no tendrán Vida en ustedes” (Jn 6:53). “El que coma de este pan vivirá eternamente” (Jn 6:58). Jesús afirma claramente que cualquiera que crea en Él dará el siguiente paso y comerá su carne eucarística. Sus primeros oyentes entendieron exactamente la progresión de su discurso y las consecuencias de lo que decía. Muchos simplemente se negaron a obedecer y comer (Jn 6:60ss). Y tú, ¿qué harás? ¿Qué responderás a la clara invitación del Señor Jesús? A no ser que comas...

Oración: Padre, a diario o tan a menudo como me sea posible, abriré de lleno mi boca para que Tú puedas llenarla con la comida de Tu cuerpo eucarístico y de Tu sangre (Sal 81:11, 17).

Promesa: “Hizo llover sobre ellos el maná, les dio como alimento un trigo celestial” (Sal 78:24).

Alabanza: Alabado seas, Jesús, Pan de vida (Jn 6:35). ¡Aleluya!

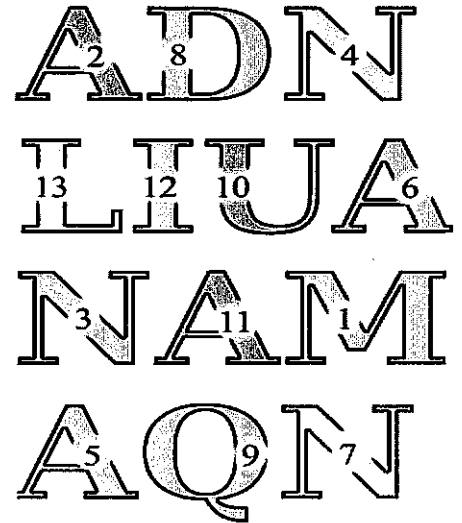
